

DISNEYLAND PARIS PRINCESS RUN

OFFICIAL RULES

ARTICLE 1: Nature of the event

The Disneyland® Paris Princess Run is a sporting event with several races.

It will take place from Friday, May 8th, 2020 to Sunday, May 10th, 2020 in the Disney® Parks of Disneyland® Paris (Disneyland® Park and Walt Disney Studios® Park).

Disneyland® Paris Princess 5K

Family race through the two Disney® Parks

Distance 5 km (3.1 miles)

Saturday, May 9th, 2020

Departure 7.00am

This race is not timed, and there will be no classification (no medical certificate required)

Disneyland® Paris Princess 8K

Running through the two Disney® Parks

Distance 8 km (6.2 miles)

Saturday, May 9th, 2020

Departure 7:00 am

This race is not timed, and there is will be no classification (no medical certificate required)

runDisney Kids Races

Running around the Lake Disney for children:

Distances 100 m, 200 m, 1 Km

Saturday, May 9th, 2020

Departures from 11:00 am in different sessions

Races are not timed and there will be no classification (no medical certificate required)

Races are not timed, no ranking, no money rewards.

The race routes will be available on the website shortly before.

They will be available on site at the Race Bib Pick up Area, Disney® Events Arena, Disney® Village also.

ARTICLE 2: Organizer

The Disneyland® Paris Princess Run is **organized by the company Euro Disney Associés S.A.S.** (company registered in the register of trade and companies of Meaux under number 397 471 822 (SIREN), domiciled at 1, rue de la Galmy - 77700 Chessy, France, and with a capital of 1.435.978.998,48€ Phone: + 33 1.64.74.40.00).

The organizer is assisted, for technical support, by the **Company Golazo Sports**, with a capital of €575 107. 05 euros, registered in the register of trade and the companies of VOKA Antwerpen, under number 0442.115.211, having its registered office at Schoebroekstraat 9, 3583 Beringen, Belgium, represented by Golazo France (14 rue Sarrette, 75014 Paris) duly authorized for the purpose of the present.

ARTICLE 3: Conditions of participation

The event complies with the regulations of races "hors Stades" (= off stadiums) subject to a procedure of administrative authorization framed by: articles L331-2 L331-7, R331-17-A331-15 of the code of sport. The participation in the event is conditional upon compliance with these rules and conditions:

A - Age category:

Participants may register at the races open to their age category:

Disneyland® Paris Princess 5K

Race - distance 5 km (3.1 miles)

Accessible from the age of 5 years old (the day of the race) and above. Men and Women
NB: Children under 12 years old (age on day of the race) must be accompanied (during the whole race) by an adult also registered with a bib for the Disneyland® Paris Princess 5K race. In this context, an adult can accompany a maximum of 3 children.

Disneyland® Paris Princess 8K

Race - distance 8 km (6.2 miles)

Available from the age of 9 years old (the day of the race) and above. Men and women.
NB: Children under 12 years old (age on day of the race) must be accompanied (during the whole race) by an adult also registered with a bib for the Disneyland® Paris Princess 5K. In this context, an adult can accompany a maximum of 3 children.

runDisney Kids Races

Race - distances: (ages at date of race)

- 100 m - Accessible to children (boys/girls): from 1-years old minimum and up to 4 years' old included. (the day of the race) from 11am in different sessions.
- 200 m - Accessible to children (boys/girls): from 5 years old minimum to 7 years old included. (the day of the race) from noon in different sessions.

- 1 km - Accessible to children (boys/girls): from 5 years old minimum to 12 years old included. (the day of the race) from 1 pm in different sessions.

One adult will be authorized to run with one child (only for children between 1 and 4 years old included) without being himself/herself registered for the race. This adult will not be able to claim for a medal.

B - Medical certificate:

No medical certificate is required for the Disneyland® Paris Princess Run races.

ARTICLE 4: Registration

A - Registration fee:

A-1 – Registration to individual races

Registration includes, for each participant:

Disneyland® Paris Princess 8K:

- 1 Bib
- 1 T-shirt
- 1 exclusive Medal for the race finishers
- Refreshments during and after the race

In step with the booking terms and conditions, not participating at the event does not allow you to claim for any refund.

Disneyland® Paris Princess 5K:

- 1 Bib
- 1 T-shirt
- 1 exclusive Medal for the race finishers
- Refreshments during and after the race

In step with the booking terms and conditions, not participating at the event does not allow you to claim for any refund.

runDisney Kids Races (any distance):

- 1 bib
- 1 T-shirt
- 1 exclusive Medal for the race finishers

- Refreshments after the race

In step with the booking terms and conditions, not participating at the event does not allow you to claim for any refund.

A-2 – Cinderella Challenge 13K

Combination of 2 races: Disneyland® Paris Princess 5K + Disneyland® Paris Princess 8K

- 1 unique bib for the 2 races
- 3 race t-shirts (Disneyland® Paris Princess 5K, Disneyland® Paris Princess 8K and Cinderella Challenge 13K)
- 1 exclusive Cinderella Challenge 13K medal in addition to the Disneyland® Paris Princess 5K and Disneyland® Paris Princess 8K (3 medals for the Challenger, in case he/she crosses both finish lines, see conditions below)

Eligibility:

- From 9 years old (on the day of the race) Men/Women
- Runners must achieve the 2 races respecting at least a pace of 9.56 minutes per kilometer
- Any runner registered separately at the Disneyland® Paris Princess 5K and Disneyland® Paris Princess 8K is not eligible for the Cinderella Challenge 13K and will not receive the Cinderella Challenge 13K t-shirt and medal.
- In case of non-participation, forfeit or injury impeding the runner to cross one or both the finish lines of Disneyland® Paris Princess 5K and/or Disneyland® Paris Princess 8K, the runner is not eligible anymore for the Cinderella Challenge 13K and will not be able to receive the Cinderella Challenge 13K medal.
- The Cinderella Challenge 13K medal is given to the runner after Disneyland® Paris Princess 8K, after checking her/his eligibility.
- Medals are not sent by mail in case of no show on the start line.
- In step with the Booking Terms and Conditions, no refund given to non attenders under any circumstances.

B - Registration Closing

The closing is set at 10/04/2020.

The organizer reserves the right to pursue registration if certain races are still available for sale.

C - Athletes with disabilities

Any athlete with disabilities must contact the organizer at the following address (dlp.run.info@disney.com) in order to bring to their attention his/ her special needs before booking.

The organizer will review the validation of the participant in consideration of the criteria of safety and adaptation of the equipment. After purchasing a race all athletes must accept the rules and regulations.

Corral departure: Upon presentation of an official document (such as a Blue Badge), the athlete with disabilities and all members of his/ her booking will start the race (s) in the first corral and with the first session of disabled athletes.

A medical certificate and a priority access card delivered by Disneyland® Paris are not official documents.

Specific rules:

c-1 Visual Deficient Athlete

Any visual deficient athlete must contact the organizer at the following address (dlp.run.info@disney.com) in order to bring to their attention his/ her special needs before booking the Disneyland® Paris Princess 5K, Disneyland® Paris Princess 8K or Cinderella Challenge 13K.

The organizer will review the validation of the participant in consideration of the criteria of safety and adaptation of the equipment.

- Registration is required for the runner and his/her guide.
- For organization and safety reasons, the guide must be identified as such, with a 'GUIDE' sticker, available upon request at the Race Bib Pick up Area, Disney® Events Arena, Disney Village®.
- In order to facilitate interactions with the organization and other runners, a sticker will be given to the athlete with disabilities upon presentation of an official document (such as Blue Badge) at the Race Bib Pick up Area, Disney® Events Arena, Disney Village®.
- Athlete with disabilities, like any other runner, must wear his bib provided by the organization, visible during the whole race. On the back of the bib the athlete must imperatively complete the Emergency Medical Information
- All participants agree to respect the official rules of the Disneyland® Paris Princess Run.

For safety reasons, it will not be possible to run accompanied by a service animal.

Corral departure: upon presentation of an official documentary proof, the visually impaired athlete and all members of his/her booking will start the race (s) in the first corral and with the first session of disabled athletes.

A medical certificate and a priority access card delivered by Disneyland® Paris are not official documents.

furthermore, we can offer a guide service to the registered participants who would like or need further assistance. Please contact dlp.run.info@disney.com before March 1st, 2020 to submit your request for a guide and acknowledge the participations conditions.

c-2 IPC Competition Wheelchair Athletes

(three wheels with braking device) which complies with IPC (- direct manual propulsion on handrails).

IPC competition wheelchair athletes can contact the organizer at the following address (dlp.run.info@disney.com) in order to bring to their attention his/ her special needs before booking the Disneyland® Paris Princess 5K, Disneyland® Paris Princess 8K or Cinderella Challenge 13K.

The organizer will review the validation of the participant in consideration of the criteria of safety and adaptation of the equipment.

- The athlete must be able to maneuver and master it in all circumstances
- Wearing a helmet that complies with current regulations and / or standardization is mandatory.

In case the athletes do not have the requested equipment, the Organizer can refuse the access to the race.

- Wearing reinforced gloves is highly recommended
- The wheelchair athlete must be secured by a seat belt
- Only participants with a recognized disability can participate in the wheelchair race.
- In order to facilitate interactions with the organization and other runners, a sticker will be given to the athlete with disabilities upon presentation of proof (such as Blue Badge) at the Race Bib Pick up Area, Disney® Events Arena, Disney Village®.
- The athlete with disabilities, like any other athlete, must wear his bib provided by the organization, visible during the whole race. On the back of the bib the athlete must imperatively complete the Emergency Medical Information
- All participants agree to respect the official rules of the Disneyland® Paris Princess Run.

Corral departure: upon presentation of an official documentary proof, the athlete using a wheelchair and all members of his/her booking or order will start the race (s) in the first corral and with the first wave of disabled athletes

A medical certificate and a priority access card delivered by Disneyland® Paris are not official documents.

In order to ensure their safety and facilitate their departure, the organization asks IPC competition wheelchair riders who are allowed to participate, to make themselves known at registration by sending a message to dlp.run.info@disney.com and before March 1st, 2020.

c-3 Athletes in Standard Wheelchairs Non-compliant with IPC Rules

Athletes in standard wheelchairs can contact the organizer at the following address (dlp.run.info@disney.com) in order to bring to their attention his/ her special needs before booking the Disneyland® Paris Princess 5K, Disneyland® Paris Princess 8K or Cinderella Challenge 13K.

The organizer will review the validation of the participant in consideration of the criteria of safety and adaptation of the equipment.

- Only participants with recognized disability can participate in the wheelchair race
- In the case the standard wheelchair athlete is accompanied by a third party, they must have a Disneyland® Paris Princess 5K bib number also;
- Wearing a helmet that complies with current regulations and / or standardization is mandatory;
- Wearing reinforced gloves is highly recommended;
- The wheelchair athlete must be secured by a seat belt;
- In order to facilitate interactions with the organization and other riders, a sticker will be given to the disabled athlete upon presentation of proof (such as Blue Badge) at the Race Bib Pick up Area, Disney® Events Arena, Disney Village®;
- The disabled athlete, like any other athlete, must visibly wear his bib provided by the organization during the entire race. On the back of the bib the athlete must imperatively complete the Emergency Medical Information sheet;
- All participants agree to respect the official rules of the Disneyland® Paris Princess Run.

The organizer will review the validation of the participant in consideration of the criteria of safety and adaptation of the equipment.

Corral departure: on presentation of an official proof (such as Blue Badge), the athlete in a standard wheelchair noncompliant with IPC rules and an attendant who has a valid bib number will start the race (s) in the first corral A and with the first wave of disabled riders. Anyone else who is part of the same reservation / order will start in another wave of corral A.

A medical certificate or a Disney Accessibility Card are not official proofs.

In order to ensure their safety and facilitate their departure, the organization asks the athletes in a standard wheelchair non-compliant with IPC rules who are allowed to participate, to make themselves known at registration by sending a message to dlp.run.info@disney.com and before March 1st, 2020.

NB: wheelchairs not authorized without official documents.

c-4 Joëlettes

Athletes using Joëlettes are not allowed to participate in the Disneyland® Paris Princess Run.

The "Hand-bike or Hand – Cycling" are not allowed at this event. This activity is considered to be a cycling sport.

c-5-Other special needs.

All athletes with any other special needs that haven't already been mentioned are advised to contact the organizer at dlp.run.info@disney.com, in order to bring to their attention any specific request before booking. The organizer will review the validation of the participant in consideration of the criteria of safety and adaptation of the equipment.

Corral departure: on presentation of an official proof (such as Blue Badge), the athlete in a standard wheelchair noncompliant with IPC rules and an attendant who has a valid bib number will start the race (s) in the first corral A and with the first wave of disabled riders. Anyone else who is part of the same reservation / order will start in another wave of corral A.

A medical certificate or a Disney Accessibility Card are not official proofs.

D – Minors

A parent or a legal guardian must complete, sign and provide the parental waiver for all participants under 18 years old, at the bib pick up, Disney® Events Arena, Disney Village®. No exceptions will be made.

The parental waiver is downloadable on the website of the event.

E– Bib

e-1 To collect your bib

You need to collect your runner's kit at the Race Bib Pick up Area Disney® Events Arena, Disney Village®, during the opening hours (dates and timetable available on the official website: run.disneylandparis.com) the day before the race. Exceptions are made for the *runDisney Kids Races*: until 10:00am (1st departure 11:00am) on the day of the race.

The runners kit includes:

- The race bib - The race(s) t-shirt(s)
- The g'EAR bag
- 4 safety pins

You will need to provide valid proof of identity. No exceptions will be made.

e-2 – To wear your bib

The athlete must clearly wear his bib provided by the organization during the entire race. On the back of the bib you must complete the Emergency Medical Information sheet. Safety pins will be provided in the runner's kit.

For safety reasons if a runner is spotted without his/her bib while in the race, he/she will be asked to leave the course.

POWER OF ATTORNEY

To retrieve another runner's kit, you must show your valid photo ID and a copy of the valid ID of the person you are picking the runner's kit for.

You will need to bring the original printed voucher, as well as a power of attorney signed by the runner. It is mandatory that this power of attorney shows your first and last name, plus the other persons first and last name and mentions the product you are collecting.

If you don't have acceptable documents, we will not be able to provide his/her race bib. No exceptions will be made.

RUNNERS KIT

No item (bib, t-shirt) will be sent by mail, prior or after the event.

T-shirt: No exchanges will be accepted after the race.

F- Proof of time and estimated of arrival

No proof of time if required for the Disneyland Paris Princess Run races.

G – Withdrawal

Any purchase on the online shop (E-shop) is a firm and final commitment and cannot be subject to any modification, cancellation, refund or transfer to a third party, for whatever reason, including medical. (Including, registration errors, unavailability or an impediment for medical reasons).

H - Process of registration for the races:

Please find below the necessary steps for registration at the races:

1. Application form online / pre-registration (*):

After the purchase of a tourist package including participation in one of the races (hotel + bib) or only attending one of the races, you will receive an e-mail with a personalized link to access the platform for registration to register for the race of your choice by filling out your runners' profile.

Please keep carefully your order number or booking reference, useful for any further communication.

NB: for a minor on the day of the race, only the legal representative of the minor is allowed to register and complete the runners profile. The legal representative must provide parental consent at the Race Bib Pick up Area, Disney® Events Arena, Disney Village® (document to be downloaded on the website of the event).

2. Initial email of confirmation:

Once the necessary information is completed, and the requested documents uploaded, the participant receive a booking confirmation email.

3. Voucher: All participants will receive an email before the event. This email will indicate that the voucher is available on the runner's space, as well as the latest practical information regarding the event. This document will be needed for the bib pick-up, as well as an official valid identification.

(* After purchase of a tourist package including participation in one of the races or only attending one of the races in the above registration process, any participant not wishing to give their email address will have to apply for registration to the Organizer by mail to: Disneyland® Paris – Val d'Europe Half-Marathon Weekend / building Minnie Mouse / BP 112-77777 Marne la Vallée - Cedex 04

NB: in this case, a manual process of registration may cause an additional delay in the validation of the registration phase. The organizer cannot be held responsible for any delay of document (s) sent by mail.

ARTICLE 5: Insurance

A – Liability

In accordance with the law, the Organizer has taken out insurance covering the consequences of its civil liability, those of their agents and all the participants in the different races of the Disneyland® Paris Princess Run.

We remind you that the Organizer is not responsible for locker bags or their contents. It is up to each participant to make the necessary arrangements for the preservation of his belongings.

B - Insurance injury

According to French law (Article L321-4 of the Sports Code), the Organizer is obliged to inform the participants of the interest of subscribing to a personal insurance policy covering bodily injury to which their practice in a sports event can expose them.

Except if they have given up, FFA athletes are covered by a personal injury insurance. Most of the usual insurance (bank card guarantees, home insurance, etc.) excludes any participation in a sports competition and therefore the risks associated with your participation in the Disneyland® Paris Princess Run.

It is important that you check the warranties and exclusions of your possible daily insurance, and if necessary, to take out individual accident insurance. This subscription is optional but highly recommended, as it is the only one that offers the practitioners of physical and sports activities a guarantee for the damage that they may cause themselves.

This one is additional to your possible current insurances. It can be done with the insurer of your choice.

By registering for this Event, the Participant declares to be in good physical condition and to have no contraindications to the practice of running. It releases Euro Disney Associates S.A.S, organizer of Disneyland® Paris Princess Run, from any liability for any damage resulting from his physical condition. The Participant authorizes the Organizer to engage in any emergency care or intervention considered required by medical and emergency personnel involved in the Event. For minor registrations, the parent or legal representative declares and authorizes the above conditions for the minor participant.

ARTICLE 6: Sporting rules

A - Jury

The jury is composed of the event race director and a representative from **Disneyland® Paris Princess 5K, Disneyland® Paris Princess 8K and runDisney Kids Races:**

B - Competitors assistance

Any external assistance including food & drinks supplies, outside the water stops area, are forbidden.

C - Followers

No follower will be accepted, under penalty of disqualification

D - Sticks

The use of telescopic walking sticks is prohibited.

E - Assistance

No external assistance to the Organizer is authorized.

F – Pacing Requirements

All Disneyland® Paris Princess 5K, Disneyland® Paris Princess 8K must be able to keep at least a pace of 9.56 minutes per kilometer. Anyone who is not able to follow the established minimum pace can be recovered at any point in the race and transported to the finish line.

It is suggested to participants to train to reach the recommended pace. Cyclists will advise runners whether they are below the pace. They will indicate you if you are below the recommended pace of 9.56 minutes per kilometer.

If for any reason you need to suddenly slow down, please keep to the right. For more information, please refer to the section "pace chart" on the official website of the event.

G - Timing

Disneyland® Paris Princess 5K, Disneyland® Paris Princess 8K and *runDisney Kids Races*:

No timing is provided on these races.

ARTICLE 7: Category, Rankings and Awards

A - Category and Ranking

Disneyland® Paris Princess 5K, Disneyland® Paris Princess 8K and *runDisney Kids Races*:

No official ranking is available, these races are not timed.

B – Awards

"Finisher" Medal- Cinderella Challenge 13K, Disneyland® Paris Princess 8K, Disneyland® Paris Princess 5K & runDisney Kids Races:

Each participant crossing the finish line will be awarded a medal, the day of the race. No medal is sent by mail.

Certificate:

after the race, it will be possible to print a personalized race certificate. The form will be downloadable from the event website (www.run-disneylandparis.com) section "Previous Events". Any information on this link will be sent to you by the organizer before the race. No certificate will be sent by mail. The winners of the general classification of the Disneyland® Paris.

Publication of the results Disneyland® Paris Princess 5K, Disneyland® Paris Princess 8K and runDisney Kids Races: No official ranking will be available because these races are not timed.

ARTICLE 8: Water stops

runDisney Kids Races: At the finish line

Disneyland® Paris Princess 5K: During the race and at the finish line

Disneyland® Paris Princess 8K: Several refreshment stations will be provided throughout the race, as well as on the arrival area. For the comfort of the runners, the organizer reserves the right to add additional points of water. These will appear on the official race map.

ARTICLE 9: Safety and Care

A - Route used

The competition takes place inside both Disney Parks, backstage and through the Disney Village®.

B- Safety of competitors

A safety plan is assured and will be sized according to each race categories attendance.

Important: no backpack bags or other bags will be accepted during the race, for safety reasons. However, a flask belt will be allowed.

Subject to change at any time in regards of safety guidelines set prior the event.

C - Mutual assistance between competitors

Any competitor is required to help and give assistance in case of an accident of another competitor, while waiting for the safety team.

D - Stands for recovery

Stands will be located at the Race Bib Pick up Area, Disney® Events Arena, Disney Village®, after the Disneyland® Paris Princess 8K.

E - Roller and/or motorized vehicles:

The pedestrian event, subject of this regulation is not accessible to all gear wheel (s), excluding those of the organization or accepted by it, and forbidden to forbidden animals.

For the safety of everyone, trolleys, strollers, baby carriers, roller skates, motorized scooters, bicycles, skateboards, canes, crutches, walkers, walking sticks or any moving accessories will not be accepted on the course. Offenders will be evacuated and transported to the finish line.

Headphones are not recommended during the race, in order to be able to hear audio messages played throughout the race to ensure the safety of all participants.

F - Costumes:

Costumes are allowed and encouraged during the *runDisney* events! Please note that costumes may not, for the safety of everyone, include a mask, and that they must not present a risk to runners (long capes, bulky accessories, etc.). Offenders will be evacuated and transported to the finish line. Regarding the presence of minors, costumes likely to shock or to detain must be changed, at the risk of being excluded from the event.

Disneyland® Paris reserves the right to deny admission to or remove anyone wearing attire that we consider inappropriate or attire that could detract from the experience of other Guests. All participants and their Guests may dress as their favorite character but must follow these guidelines as determined solely by Disney. Costumes must be family-friendly and may not be obstructive, offensive, objectionable or violent. Costumes should not allow by their volume or texture, hiding or transporting any item.

G- Bag deposit: Participants will receive a clear plastic bag, g'EAR bag. This can be collected together with the bib/T-shirt and used for baggage lockers the day of the event.

You must use this clear bag, no exceptions will be made, no other bag will be accepted.

All g'EAR bags that are not recovered by the participants at the end of the race will be transferred to the "lost and found" service of Disneyland® Paris.

The organizer cannot be held responsible for any loss, damaged or stolen items. We recommend that participants do not drop off valuables. The Organizer is not responsible

for bags or their content. It is the responsibility of each participant to take the necessary measures for the preservation of his/her personal belongings.

ARTICLE 10: Environmental Protection

Any leftover equipment, any waste thrown out of the premises provided for this purpose, will result in the expulsion of the offending participant. It is forbidden to throw any rubbish on the grounds during the Disneyland® Paris Princess Races.

ARTICLE 11: Image rights

Through its participation in the races of the Disneyland® Paris Princess Run, each participant grants gracefully, Euro Disney Associés S.A.S. or any person authorized by Euro Disney Associés S.A.S. including companies affiliated or related group to The Walt Disney Company ("Disney group") to photograph and film their image or their minors participating in the race, for use on all papers, audiovisual media, Multimedia, destination information, advertising, promotional and commercial, including all editions: mailings, postcards, display, pop and inserts press, etc.. Packaging, sales pitches, broadcasting, network cable, film, digital, optical and magnetic media, telematics networks and information networks remotely (including internet and all social networking sites), etc. for the purpose of promotion of the Disneyland® Paris Princess Run or more generally the company Euro Disney and its activities as well as those of the Disney Company.

Each participant and his beneficiaries as universal and title waives expressly and irrevocably, to make any claim or legal action regarding the present release. This authorization is valid for the whole world during a period of 5 years from your agreement of the said regulations during the phase of the runner profile's registration.

ARTICLE 12: Cancellation / Force majeure

The event may be cancelled either at the request of the administrative authority, or due to force majeure, including weather and security reasons. Possible refundable terms will be determined by the seller. The start of the races may also be delayed or postponed according to the weather conditions. In case of Force majeure, the participants will be warned by all possible means, they will then have to follow strictly the guidelines of the organization. Failure to observe these instructions, will lead, to the end of the responsibility of the organizer.

ARTICLE 13: Acceptance of the regulations
